These three sunny spots, The Ritz-Carlton Residences Sunny Isles Beach in Miami, Florida; ONE Sotheby's Riva in Fort Lauderdale, Florida; and Scrub Island Resort, Spa& Marina in the British Virgin Islands, all make exceptional spots to nest.

Fort Lauderdale is renowned not only for its beautiful, sunny beaches, but also for its status as an international yachting hub and host to the yachting industry's largest annual event. But if you haven't looked farther than the marina lately, it's worth mentioning that Fort Lauderdale has grown into a luxury resort city with five-star everything at every turn.
